Dear Picklers,

I'd like to take a few minutes to tell you about an exciting new mentoring program just getting started. This program is a way for our pickleball community to pay back the volunteers who are working so very hard to support the PicklePlex® tournaments. Currently, we have a group of 12 mentors who will be helping with these sessions. We hope to grow this number as the snowbirds come back in town.

Here's how it works. The Volunteer Committee will hold monthly raffles, selecting up to 16 of our tournament volunteers to be partnered with 8 mentors. These mentoring sessions will be limited to two hours. They will consist of two 30 minute game-playing sessions along with 15 minutes of exhibition games. Any time remaining will be open to specific questions you might have about your game, the rules, or anything else that is pickleball related. These mentoring sessions will be held once a month for the next 6 months on the following Sundays:

New PicklePlex® Court Designations...

With many seasonal players soon to return to the courts, PRP Board members met with the PicklePlex® Board of Directors to discuss and plan for the best way to utilize all 16 courts to the benefit of all players. The following diagram displays how each court will be utilized. Remember as always- PicklePlex® is a family friendly environment with no smoking or foul language, and shoes and shirts must be worn at all times.

Courts 13 - 16 Rules Beginner Court for folks new to the game... Challenge courts for higher skilled players Scheduled Activities (Kids Camp, High School, etc) Reassess in 6 months (want to give "In Season" some time before changing) Self enforcement to start (trying to avoid court monitors) Educate as many folks as possible No smoking; Family Environment, watch your language Group Open Play 1 Game - come off court and restack paddles No shoes, No Shirt = No Play First 4 paddles take first available court Paddle Stack Challenge Courts - 3.5-Paddle Stack Cts 10-16 15 13 9 16 14 12 11 10 8 6 5 3 2 1 4 Paddle Stack Cts 2-7 Beginner Court - 2.5-Challenge Court - 4.0+ Courts 2 - 7, 11 - 12 Rules Courts 1, 9, 10 Rules Court 8 Rules Beginner Court Group Open Play Challenge Courts (4.0+ / 3.5-) 1 Game - come off court and restack paddles 2 Paddle Stacks - Winners hold court Single Paddle Stacks First 4 paddles take first available court 3 Game Maximum 1 Game – come off court and restack paddles

KEY:

Dark Green- Courts # 1, 9, 10 (Challenge Courts for skill level 4.0+/3.5-)

Dark Green-Court #8 (Beginner Court)

Med. Green-Courts # 13, 14, 15, 16 (Scheduled event play...high school, campers, etc. Otherwise open group play)

.......

Light Green-Courts # 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 11, 12 (Group Open Play)

***The above court designations came about after many meetings and discussions. Attempts were made to get opinions from both new players and experienced players, intermediate and advanced. The plan is to reassess these court designations in 6 months to see if modifications need to be made.
