

ONLINE SURVEY — FINAL RESULTS

We ended up with about 60 responses...thank you for your input!!!

The goal of our survey was to find out what our Pickleball Community thinks about league play and what they would like us to offer them along this type of play. We asked questions about when people would like to play and what format and venue desires they would prefer. We will use the information received to help us set up the leagues for the 2018-2019 season. We will aim to be flexible, adjusting our thinking based on actual turn-out and continued feedback from players. Our survey gives us a great jumping off point!

The top two league types chosen were the Shootout format on a weekday morning and a Team Play format, also on a weekday morning. Two thirds of our survey input indicated league play is desired from November through April. Five out of six wanted mixed double leagues. There was also a desire for weekend or weekday evening play.

As we set up leagues this year, we will utilize this information and hopefully people will have an opportunity to join a fun, challenging league!

COURTESY PLEASE!



Each month we will attempt to feature little tidbits from various sources and members. Your suggestions are welcome!

Before you begin your game, always come to the net and introduce yourself. If you know all the players, wish them a good game. It's common courtesy to begin in a friendly man-

ner.

After the game is over, always come to the net and tap paddles or handles, bump fist, and say something nice. "Nice game", "great plays", "thanks for the game".

When a ball bounces out of bounds, try to call "OUT" right away, or point a finger up indicating out of bounds. Your opponent should not have to ask you if it was out.

If your partner believes the ball is going out before it actually lands outside the court, he/she should call "NO" or "BOUNCE IT" to alert you that it MIGHT be out, rather than saying "out". Remember, a ball is not out until it bounces outside the court.

SAFETY: Always wear eye protection. There are a number of quality sports glasses that are very effective at every price point, but even frames without lenses are better than nothing. So many players have had eye injuries (including detached retina) from being hit by the ball. The ball can also ricochet off the paddle, causing a similar situation. BE SAFE, NOT SORRY!


